COLLECT FOR THE DAY

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Acts 14:8-18

And in Lystra a certain man without strength in his feet was sitting, a cripple from his mother's womb, who had never walked. ⁹ *This* man heard Paul speaking. Paul, observing him intently and seeing that he had faith to be healed, ¹⁰ said with a loud voice, "Stand up straight on your feet!" And he leaped and walked. ¹¹ Now when the people saw what Paul had done, they raised their voices, saying in the Lycaonian *language*, "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!" ¹² And Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul, Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. ¹³ Then the priest of Zeus, whose temple was in front of their

city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates, intending to sacrifice with the multitudes.

¹⁴But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard this, they tore their clothes and ran in among the multitude, crying out ¹⁵ and saying, "Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men with the same nature as you, and preach to you that you should turn from these useless things to the living God, who made the heaven, the earth, the sea, and all things that are in them, ¹⁶ who in bygone generations allowed all nations to walk in their own ways. ¹⁷ Nevertheless He did not leave Himself without witness, in that He did good, gave us rain from heaven and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness." ¹⁸ And with these sayings they could scarcely restrain the multitudes from sacrificing to them. (NKJV)

THE GOSPEL LESSON: John 14:23-29

Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him. ²⁴ He who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word which you hear is not Mine but the Father's who sent Me.

²⁵ "These things I have spoken to you while being present with you. ²⁶ But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. ²⁸ You have heard Me say to you, 'I am going away and coming *back* to you.' If you loved Me, you would rejoice because I said, 'I am going to the Father,' for My Father is greater than I. ²⁹ "And now I have told you before it comes, that when it does come to pass, you may believe." (NKJV)

Theme: The Holy City Jerusalem: Our Safe Place

- I. Dwelling within Secure Walls
- II. Possessing the Securest of Relationships with our God and Savior

SERMON TEXT: Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great and high mountain, and showed me the great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God, ¹¹ having the glory of God. Her light *was* like a most precious stone, like a jasper stone, clear as crystal. ¹² Also she had a great and high wall with twelve gates, and twelve angels at the gates, and names written on them, which are *the names* of the twelve tribes of the children of Israel: ¹³ three gates on the east, three gates on the north, three gates on the south, and three gates on the west.

- ¹⁴Now the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.
- ²²But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. ²³The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb *is* its light. (NKJV)

CHURCH PROPERTY MAINTENANCE PROJECTS:

ROOFING: In a special voters meeting last Sunday the church accepted a proposal from K&L Construction from Austin for \$53,625.00 to replace the shingles both on the church roof and the parsonage roof. Any additional roof repairs (ie: plywood sheeting) will be an added expense. Much of the cost of this project is covered by insurance, however the remaining balance will more than deplete the balance in the Property Improvement Fund. Please prayerfully consider making a special offering to the Property Improvement Fund to help with the cost of these roofing repairs, and to help replenish the balance in the Property Improvement fund for future capital improvements and any necessary maintenance that may arise.

Water Line repair: The water service to the church started to leak into the church basement. Since this leak occurred before the meter it has been repaired by Austin Public Utilities without any expense to the church. However, it required some excavation both in the church basement and outside the main church doors. Please be cautious until all repairs are finished.
